Revisional endoscopic surgery after gastric bypass

The importance of the restrictive component of gastric bypass procedures is well recognized. Dilatation of the pouch-outlet, the pouch volume itself and the presence of a gastro-gastric fistula after gastric bypass are three factors responsible for substantial weight gain, volume per meal increases, rapid pouch emptying invites for binge-eating. Revisional surgery should be avoided by doing the first operation as it should, but if necessary it is often difficult and prone to at least double the morbidity of the primary operation and with unknown long term results. Narrowing the stoma size, closure of a gastrogastric fistula endoscopically with the OTSC clip is a very effective and safe alternative. Presentation of a study on 118 patients endoscopically treated either for stoma dilatation or gastrogastric fistula between october 2008 and june 2009
